Granulomatous disorders represent a unique group of diseases both non-infectious and infectious that require the utmost clinical pathologic correlation combined with a keen sense of inquiry for underlying systemic disease. Some of these diseases are common and some are rare; however all dermatologists need to diagnose and manage these diseases whether common or rare. This issue of *Dermatology Clinics* Granulomatous Disorders of the Adult Skin supplies the readers with a comprehensive, up to date, and evidence based review of multiple granulomatous disorders (i.e. palisading, epithelioid, xanthomatous, caseating, suppurative, vasculitic, lymphoproliferative, foreign body).
