Over the next few decades, Texas forgot everything the Rangers had learned about Indian fighting. Texas and the United

States fell back on traditional military tactics and peace negotiations. Negotiating with the Comanche never worked: the tribe's warriors broke treaties and promises time and again, then came back and offered to renegotiate. By the 1860s, cholera, smallpox and other European diseases had crippled many Comanche tribes. Nevertheless, the remaining tribesmen remained formidable and their attacks actually pushed the frontier back east. Then, the United States government decided to give up on negotiations.
